We believe the current system where the state government oversees regulations to protect fish and wildlife is the better system, not hunters and fishermen.
Citizen Initiated	Amendment 3	Legalize Marijuana	Would make it legal for adults 21 and older to have up to 3 ounces of marijuana and up to 5 grams of cannabis concentrate. It would also allow them to possess, purchase and use marijuana projects and accessories without needing a medical marijuana card, as is the case now.	We recommend a YES on 3. This would ensure accountability, transparency, and regulations in place regarding marijuana. It will add tax revenues for government. It will mean less government interference in the lives of adults and fewer tax dollars wasted on unnecessary arrests and prosecutions for simple possession of marijuana.
